## **Glick to participate in ABA Labor and Employment Law Section's National Symposium on Technology in April**

**April 5, 2016:** The national profile achieved by Gail Glick fighting a corporation's requirement to install an app tracking an employee's location on her cell phone even when the employee was off the clock has led to an invitation from the American Bar Association to participate in its Labor and Employment Section's National Symposium on Technology in Washington, D.C. on April 8, 2016.

Glick will participate in the Symposium's case study session titled "The Case of the Intrusive App" as the plaintiff-side attorney in the session. The mock hearing will receive an analysis of intrusive workplace apps, a demonstration of the data they can collect, and how they are used. Both sides of the issue will be presented and an arbitrator will decide who should prevail and why.

The ABA case study is based on last year's confrontation between Glick's client, Myrna Arias, and Intermex Wire Transfer LCC in Kern County Superior Court in May, 2015.

The case received world-wide publicity in a variety of media from MSN to The New York Times to Daily Kos and Slate and involved Glick appearing on CNN, Fox Business network, Fox and Friends, WGN and CBC radio, among many other news sources.
